Hello Milford Families,

For the last eight weeks we sent our e-newsletter each Friday. Moving forward we are going to go back to our once-a-month schedule to send out the e-newsletter. I want to thank the families who provided feedback on our school calendar. The feedback told us that parents prefer for us to keep a two week winter break, keep spring break a consistent week each year, and that you would like the school year to end before Memorial Day. Our staff was surveyed also and they indicated that they did not want to start the school year with a five-day week. We are currently working on drafting the new calendar and will present it to the Board of Education on October 15. We're excited to be able to take the feedback from parents and staff and design a calendar that meets most needs.

This week was Homecoming Week at the high school, and it was so great to see our community come out to support our students and attend the Reverse Homecoming Parade on Wednesday evening. A huge thank you to Student Council, Dan Yager, Ashley Kirkland, Erin Vore, and Aaron Zupka. Also, thank you to our Milford and Miami Township Police and Fire Departments.

This week Clermont County went into the red category on Ohio's Public Health Advisory System due to an increase in outpatient care visits and emergency department visits. This does not affect our school district at this time. In-Person schooling will continue. Health Commissioner Julieann Nesbit has indicated that there are a small number of outbreaks, the majority of which are in long term care facilities. She does not believe it warrants any change in practices.

I want to take this time to thank our District Nurse, Patty Price. Patty works tirelessly to make sure our students and staff remain safe and healthy. She is on call 24-7 during this pandemic and communicates directly with Clermont County Health Department on cases in our district.
