# Graduation Requirements for Class of 2019 and Beyond 

## 1) Course Requirements (NOT Changed)

| Ohio Course Requirement | Minimum Units Required |

| English | 4.0 credits |
| Mathematics | 4.0 credits |
| Science | 3.0 credits |
| Social Studies | 3.0 credits |
| Health | 0.5 credits |
| P.E. | 0.5 credits (2 semesters OR Waiver) |

## 2) Assessment Requirements

To earn credit, students must complete end-of-course exams in each of the seven subjects listed below. End-of-course exams include two components: PBA—Performance Based Assessment (Given in February/March) \& EOC-End of Year Exam (Given in May). These components are combined to give students an End-of-Course score. Scores are the following: 1-Limited; 2-Basic; 3-Proficient; 4Accelerated; 5-Advanced.

*Students who took any of the courses (e.g. Integrated Math 1 or Integrated Math 2) prior to July 1, 2014 will receive an automatic score of ' 3 ' for that end-of-course exam.
*Transfer students can be exempt from certain exams based on transcript. However, students must still take English 10 and Integrated Math 2.

## 3) Demonstration of Readiness Requirement

Students can demonstrate readiness in one of 3 ways:

| Pathway 1 | Students earn a total of 18 points or more from the seven required exams. (Breakdown of <br> required points: Math-4 points minimum; English-4 points minimum; Science/Social <br> Studies-6 points minimum) |
| :--- | :--- |
| Pathway 2 | Students meet college readiness benchmarks on a national college admission test (e.g. <br> ACT/SAT) |
| Pathway 3 | Student earns an approved industry-recognized credential and earns workforce readiness <br> score on job skills assessment |

## *Regardless of chosen pathway, ALL students must complete the course requirements and assessment requirements.
