

## Graduation Requirements for Class of 2019 and Beyond

### 1) Course Requirements (NOT Changed)

Ohio Course Requirement	Minimum Units Required
English	4.0 credits
Mathematics	4.0 credits
Science	3.0 credits
Social Studies	3.0 credits
Health	0.5 credits
P.E.	0.5 credits (2 semesters OR Waiver)
Electives	6.0 credits

Total: 21 credits

### 2) Assessment Requirements

To earn credit, students must complete end-of-course exams in each of the seven subjects listed below. End-of-course exams include two components: PBA—Performance Based Assessment (Given in February/March) & EOC—End of Year Exam (Given in May). These components are combined to give students an End-of-Course score. Scores are the following: 1-Limited; 2-Basic; 3-Proficient; 4-Accelerated; 5-Advanced.

English 9	Biology
English 10	American History
Integrated Math 1	American Government
Integrated Math 2	^^For American History and American Government listed above can be substituted with AP Exams

\*Students who took any of the courses (e.g. Integrated Math 1 or Integrated Math 2) prior to July 1, 2014 will receive an automatic score of '3' for that end-of-course exam.

\*Transfer students can be exempt from certain exams based on transcript. However, students must still take English 10 and Integrated Math 2.

### 3) Demonstration of Readiness Requirement

Students can demonstrate readiness in one of 3 ways:

Pathway 1	Students earn a total of 18 points or more from the seven required exams. (Breakdown of required points: Math—4 points minimum; English—4 points minimum; Science/Social Studies—6 points minimum)
Pathway 2	Students meet college readiness benchmarks on a national college admission test (e.g. ACT/SAT)
Pathway 3	Student earns an approved industry-recognized credential and earns workforce readiness score on job skills assessment

**\*Regardless of chosen pathway, ALL students must complete the course requirements and assessment requirements.**
